RE: NOTICE TO FAMILIES & SCHOOL STAFF of GRADES 7-12 CLASSES of Debden School

Public Health staff are working closely with the school investigating possible exposure to a COVID -19 infected person **while attending the school on the following dates Nov 6 – 17th. Students and staff of the 7-12 classes have been identified as close contacts and are required to isolate by PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER until midnight of December 1st**. Those who remain well can resume their usual activities on **December 2nd**.

Public Health will not be contacting the individual families. Testing is available by contacting 811. Please inform them you/your child is a close contact.

Anyone who develops COVID-19 symptoms should continue to self –isolate and arrange for testing by calling 811. Please indicate you/your child is a close contact.

The virus spreads from person to person through direct contact with large, respiratory droplet, from a cough, sneeze, or surfaces recently touched by an infected person. Day to day preventative actions in all public settings continue to include frequent hand hygiene, social distancing of 2 meters, wearing a face mask in public settings and when distance is not possible, avoiding large gatherings and staying home if ill.
